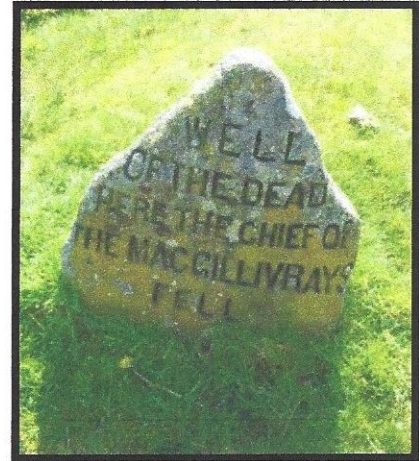
Introduction

These are just draft notes; but as I plan to post them on my website (www.artstraveling.com), I thought it best to do it now, as it is unsure when I will get the time to finish this research, although I plan to complete it in 2023. In other words, I can always update this later; at least other people will now have access to the family trees and some of the ScotlandsPeople certificates (incomplete).

Iain's family tree

I have already researched this 15 years ago around 2006. In fact, I say I have researched this. In fact, it is rather my cousin, Iain MacGillivray (son of my Uncle Donald and Auntie Bett) who did the research. Ironically, I never really met many of my cousins during my childhood for one reason or another.

I think Iain gave me his family tree in 2010 at my mother's 'wake' at my brother Gavin's house, 1 Copse Edge, Burpham, Guildford, Surrey (or maybe he sent it as an attachment to an email, I'm not sure). His family tree is handwritten and demonstrates considerable research!



Illustrious ancestors

I mention Iain here not only because he has made my work easier, but because he made it interesting by referring to various 'glorious' family connections in the mists of the family history.

The MacGillivray's at Culloden¹

Not least McGillivray's who led the rebellion against the English oppressors at Culloden (1746). Of course, the Scots were defeated, but like Christ on the cross, defeat was 'victory for the oppressed'. Comically, the recent soccer game in 2021 between the English and the Scots that ended in a 0-0 draw at Wembley was considered by the Scots to be a 'victory'.

David Livingstone²

But Iain also mentioned connections of the family to David Livingstone.

In this connection, I will cite my own book about my grandmother's family, on the Isle of Eigg: "Eigg and Some of its People"³:

“However, of special interest on the 1867 marriage certificate is the fact that Flora MacLeod’s mother was Margaret Livingstone! When I visited Eigg in 2007 I by chance met my cousin Dawn Driscoll (m.s. MacGillivray); she told me that her brother, Iain MacGillivray, had discovered that John MacKinnon was a nephew of David Livingstone, the explorer. The story goes that Livingstone left 10 shillings to all his relatives. Katie MacKinnon is said to have a record of the money that was left. Of course, I was a little sceptical to this ‘story’ originally – but my discovery that John MacKinnon’s grandmother on his mother’s side of the family was Margaret Livingstone has dispelled my scepticism.”

I have done some brief research to find out the connections between Margaret Livingstone and David Livingstone – without much success – so this is something one can research at a later point.

But strictly speaking, this is something that belongs to my maternal mother’s side of the family (the Campbells and Mackinnons – see the 1867 marriage certificate included here), not the MacGillivrays. But I include it here, as this was something Iain and Dawn MacGillivray pointed out to me.

I have started on some 5-generation family trees (Excel). These are fairly simple, but I have not made much progress.

In other words, my plan is to use Iain’s complicated handwritten tree and transpose it to ‘5 generation family trees’ (to keep things simple).

Mike Dixon

Another ‘illustrious’ relation is the Mike Dixon, the biathlon athlete.

I have done too little research here but he seems to be my grandfather’s (Hector MacGillivray?) younger brother’s grandson. I will include his career in a footnote here. ⁴

1891 census John McGillivray

I can’t quite read the address apart from the fact that it is on Tobermoray, Mull. I thought Hector’s family were from Acharacle in the county of Argyll. But these are all locations that are within a crow’s flying distance of each other. But instead of making so many suppositions perhaps I should keep to the ‘facts’. In the 1891 census, John was 40. His wife Flora (ms MacNaughton was 35). They had three children, Hector aged 5 (who is comically called a ‘scholar’). Alexander (3), as well as William (1). According to Iain’s ‘tree’ they later had four more children, Bella, John, Donald and Flora.

Interestingly, John is called a ‘mason’. This relates to an ‘interview’ with my mother – I forget the details, but she said that John had built an impressive house in Acharacle which her side of the family should have inherited for one reason or another but didn’t. This is particularly

interesting from a British social perspective, because in the twentieth century the working classes and the middle classes were identified by their jobs and their property (tenants or owners). In other words, my mother's family lost the opportunity to climb the social ladder, but my mother rectified this by marrying her lower middle class husband, Alexander Whitecross Harkness, who inherited a small property in Edinburgh (2 Chesser Loan).

The other interesting detail from this census is that John was born in Inverness shire. while his wife born in Argyllshire (I can't quite read what is written).

Marriage of John McGillivray 1885

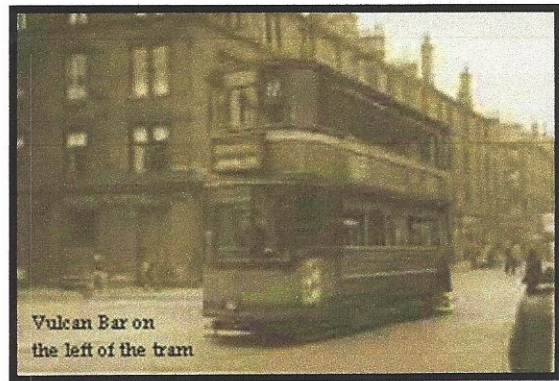
John McGillivray (34 yrs) (mason) (Acharacle) – his father is Hector McGillivray (blacksmith), and his mother is Ann (m.s. Robertson); His wife is Flora MacNaughton (domestic servant) (29 yrs old). Her father is John MacNaughton (crofter); the mother is Isabella (m.s. MacMillan). Married in the established Church of Scotland.

Social climbing

Interesting here is the idea of social mobility, and the idea that it is perhaps the females that move up a class by marriage – this seems to contradict many fictional accounts, such as "Room at the Top" (John Braine) and "Lady Chatterley's Lover" (D.H.Lawrence), where men do the social climbing through sexual encounters with women from a higher class. However, it seems to make more sense that it was the women who were the 'social climbers'; the fictional accounts are perhaps more a question of 'male bravado'. In reality, women are perhaps not that interested in a man's 'sexual qualifications', but more interested in their economic and social position. Whereas, women of a lower class can use their sexual attractiveness to move up a class. I mention this here because the MacGillivrays were perhaps belonging to the 'upper' working class (masons), while the MacNaughtons belonged to the lower agricultural class (crofters).

1918 marriage Morag Campbell and Hector MacGillivray (soldier)

This is also a case of 'social climbing' – Morag the country girl and Hector the son of a mason. Hector worked as a 'spirit salesman' more or less all his life. I'm not sure of the status of being a 'spirit salesman'. My mother often implicitly suggested that being a 'mason' (Hector's father) was something to be proud of, whereas being content to work as a spirit salesman all your life seemed to suggest a lack of ambition. On the other hand, it was quite an



accomplishment to keep the same job for 30 years, through the Great Depression and the Second World War, and period of Austerity! I am not sure of the social status of 'spirit salesman' – that is, if it was equal to that of being a mason (like his father, John). But, I am perhaps looking at this from a modern perspective – that is, being a 'barman' today is something that is a semi-skilled job, whereas, in 1920, it might have been considered a 'trade' (thus I need to do more research here). I think my mother underestimated her father – I think this had something to do with her mother and the lodger 'Abbie' Brown – but this is discussed elsewhere. But the simple fact that he held this job down for 30 years at Macmillan's Bar in Vulcan Street indicates that this was no 'precarious' job. Thus, it seems my mother underestimated the value of her father's job because of the 'floozy' tendencies of his wife (and his lack of 'reaction'), and the fact that her own husband, Alex, was too prone to alcohol abuse (love of whisky) – thus, in her mind the idea of 'selling spirit' had negative connotations.

Hector and Morag

When they married, she is 26 and he is 33. She is living in the 'slums' (Govan). But there is some confusion here. I have suggested that she moved socially upwards – but this is not so clear cut – because she has established an address in Glasgow – and he moves in with her (lack of evidence here). This seems to suggest that she was the dominant partner in the relationship. So by the time she had moved to Glasgow she was no longer a 'country girl', but was in fact 'superior' to him as she had now attained a working class status in a big city. In other words, it is always problematic if you start 'generalising'. Nb. because he moved into 81 Plantation Street, Govan (documentation lacking here).

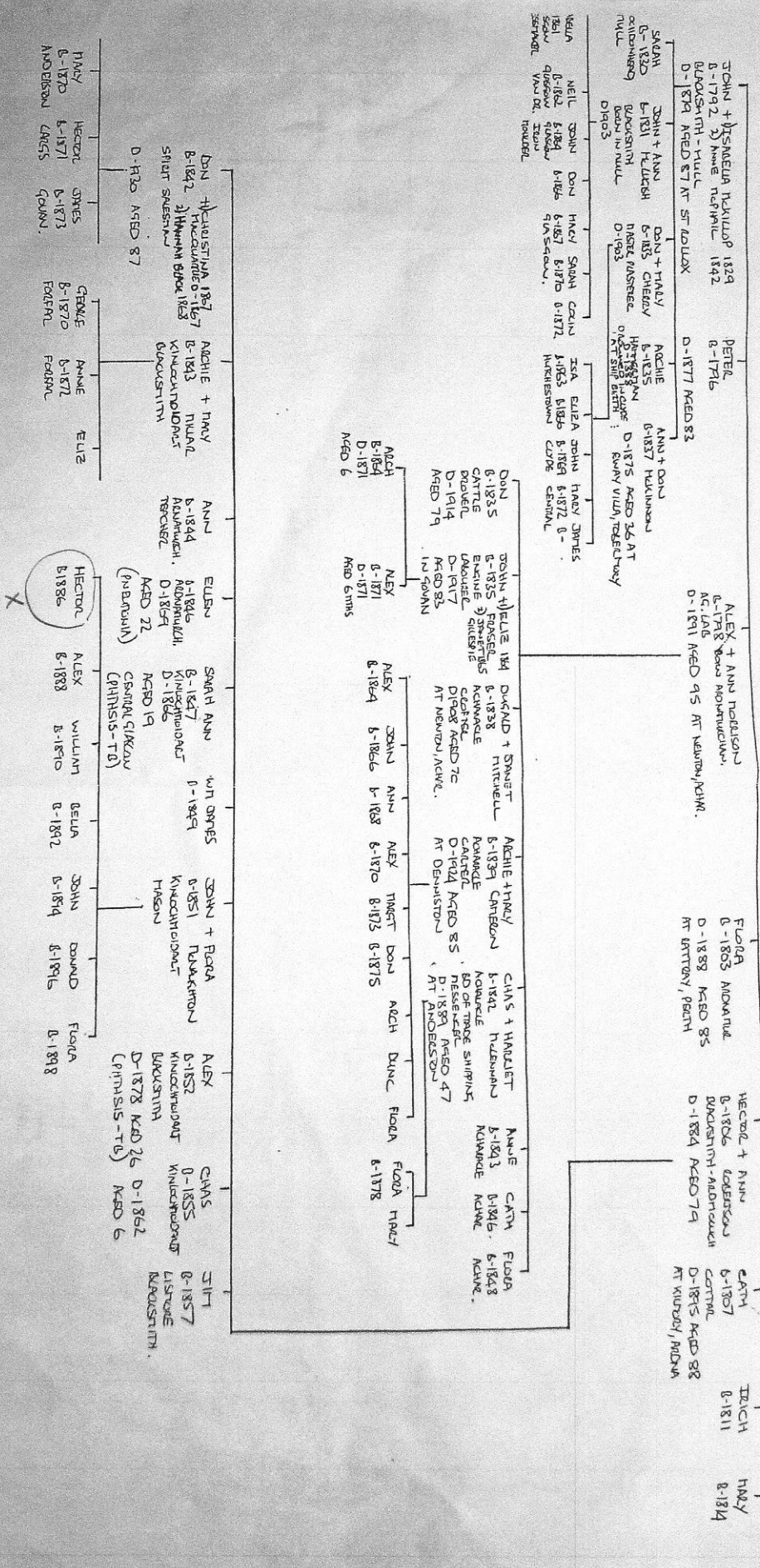
Marriage of Archibald MacGillivray and Ann Stewart (1788) – see enclosed certificate

It was no easy matter tracking down this certificate on ScotlandsPeople that corresponds with Iain's family tree. One point that perhaps is unsure here is that her son Hector (born

1806) would have been born 28 years after her marriage. This is not totally unfeasible – but requires further research.

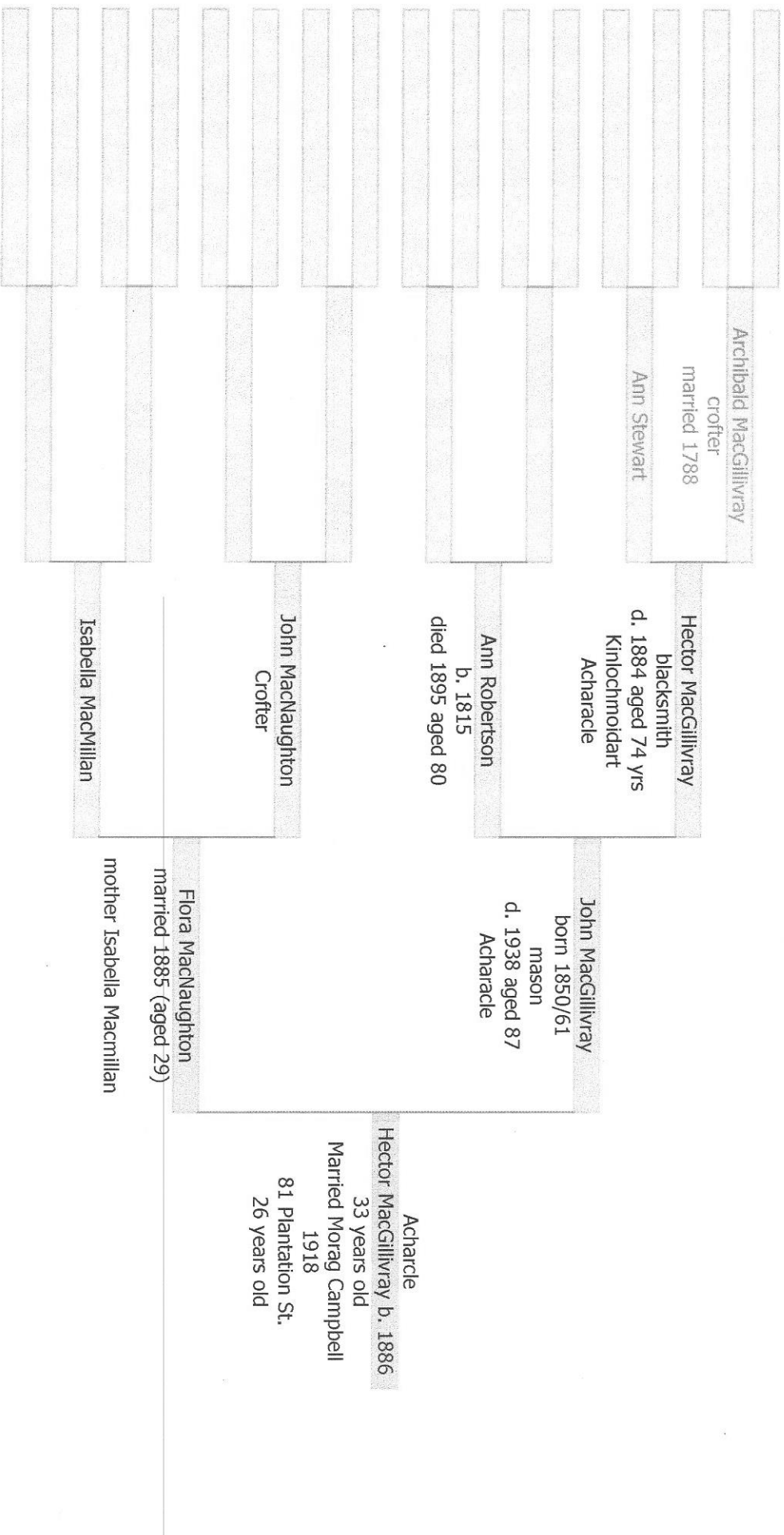

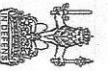
